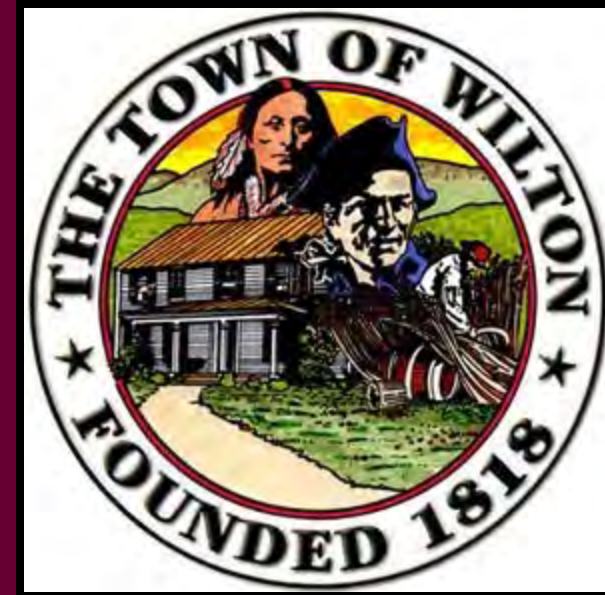

**Be Prepared for**  
**Short-Term Emergencies**

**Every household should have an emergency kit that contains enough supplies for at least three days.**

**Try to pack these items in bags that can be easily carried in case relocation is necessary.**

***This kit should contain:***

- **Water -recommended one gallon per day per person.**
- **Food -items that do not require refrigeration and little or no water to prepare. Energy Bars, Granola Bars, Dried Fruit, Peanut Butter and Ready-to-Eat Soups are excellent items to pack.**
- **Flashlights and Batteries**
- **Radio with extra Batteries**
- **First Aid Kit**
- **Any and all Medications**
- **Hand Can Opener, a Knife, Garbage Bags, plastic silver ware and plates**
- **Clothing for everyone including Coats, Gloves and Sturdy Shoes or Boots**
- **Blankets**
- **Personal Items such as Glasses, ID Cards, Insurance Policies and other Important Papers**
- **Sanitary Supplies, Health and Beauty Aids and Personal Hygiene Items**
- **Cash -have an emergency supply of cash**
- **Pet Supplies for your pets**
- **Small Shovel, Maps and Blankets for your car - your car should have a smaller version of this emergency kit in the event you get stranded.**
- **You should keep your cell phone charged and with you at all times.**

# Wilton Wildlife Preserve & Park

Wilton, NY

## Our Mission

The mission of the Wilton Wildlife Preserve & Park (WWPP) is to conserve ecological systems and natural settings, while providing opportunities for environmental education and recreational experiences.



The WWPP represents a partnership between the Town of Wilton, The Nature Conservancy, and the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. Created in 1996, its goals are to protect and restore the endangered Karner blue butterfly, preserve open space, and provide recreational and environmental education opportunities.

There is a board of directors that oversees preserve and park activities.



The goal is to protect 3,000 acres of land for these purposes. Efforts to achieve these goals are occurring east of I-87 from the Ballard Road area in the north to south of King Road in the south. Within this area ten parcels encompassing approximately 800 acres are currently protected. In addition, there are 587 acres of county forestland within the study area. Four of the protected parcels are developed with trails for passive uses.

In order to achieve identified goals, preserve staff and volunteers work to protect land, manage Karner blue butterfly habitat, restore areas for the [Karner blue butterfly](#), develop passive recreation opportunities, and educate the public. †

Wilton is part of a geologic area that extends from Glens Falls to Albany. Following the retreat of the glaciers some 10,000 to 20,000 years ago, this area was low lying and became the basin of a large lake, Glacial Lake Albany. Rivers emptied into the lake and deposited sand and silt. The lake's basin slowly rebounded from the pressure the glaciers had exerted. The soil was very sandy. Prevailing winds blew these sandy soils into dunes. These actions are largely responsible for the preserve and park's geology and topography.

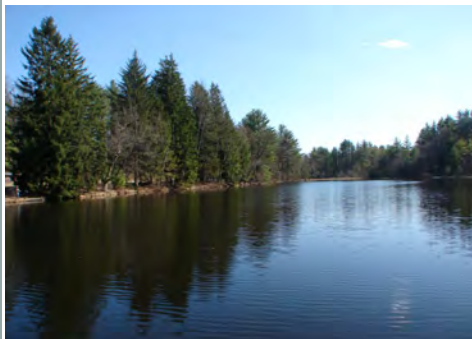

## Hiking and Fishing in Wilton

Ten miles of trails are open to the public for a variety of non-motorized uses. Each location offers its own environmental benefits for public enjoyment. Residents should feel free to explore and enjoy the many benefits of these locations.



**Camp Saratoga**—310 acres owned by the Town of Wilton which includes 5 miles of Trails for your Hiking Pleasure, Beautiful Delegan Pond for Fishing, Cabins and a Pavilion for Community and Group Activities.

**Directions:** From I-87 Exit 16, head east on Ballard Road. Turn right onto Edie Road. At the first intersection, turn left onto Scout Road. Continue until you see the main grounds at 90 Scout Road just before the underpass. Parking is on the left side of the road.

**Neilmann Parcel**—140 acres also owned by the Town of Wilton and includes approximately 1.9 miles of trails for your hiking pleasure. The Wilton Wildlife Preserve and Park will often use this parcel for educational opportunities. **Directions:** Take Route 50 north from I-87 Exit 15. At approximately 3.5 miles, turn right onto King Road. At the first intersection, turn right on Ruggles Road. There is a parking area approximately 100 yards down the road on the right side.

**The remaining two trailheads are not owned by the Town of Wilton, however, they are available for public use. Wilton Wildlife Preserve and Park offers some educational opportunities at these sites during the year.**

**Old Gick Farm**—135 acres, 1.75 miles of trail owned by NYS DEC. This trailhead is on Route 50, approximately 3.8 miles north of I-87 Exit 15. There is a sign and parking area on your left.

**Opdahl Farm**—35 acres, 1 mile of trail owned by The Nature Conservancy. This trail begins on Ballard Road, approximately 1 mile east of I-87 Exit 16. There is an access drive before the old barn on the right hand side. Parking is in a cleared field.
